



Community Grants Program Guidelines 2020 Annual Grant

Overview + Goals:

In February 2019, Portland City Council unanimously voted to approve an Enhanced Services District in the Central Eastside. The Central Eastside's Enhanced Services District is known as Central Eastside Together.

As a part of Central Eastside Together we are awarding grants to projects within the Central Eastside Industrial District. Grants are available to community organizations providing services in district that support Central Eastside Together's core values and goals listed below. All grant funds must be used for projects in the Central Eastside Industrial District.

This grant program will continue at least through 2022 when Central Eastside Together goes back in front of Portland City Council. Grants will be available annually based on a July - June fiscal year.

Important Dates:

- September 14, 2020: Application Opens
- November 13, 2020: Application Due
- December 1, 2020 - December 31, 2021: Projects occur

Central Eastside Together Goals:

- Increase cleanliness throughout the Central Eastside
- Improve safety for all in the Central Eastside
- Brand the Central Eastside to increase business, customers and visitors
- Support innovation in all forms including strengthening Central Eastside as an employment center
- Increase economic viability of the Central Eastside and promote prosperity for all
- Ensure Central Eastside is an ideal place to create, work, live and visit

Project Types:

Central Eastside Together only funds projects taking place within the Central Eastside Together Boundary. The organizations conducting the projects must be 501c3 non-profits. Fiscal sponsorships are accepted as well. Partnerships are encouraged, and projects with partnerships will be more competitive. Projects should be completed between December 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021. Capital projects and capacity building projects are not eligible for funding. The average grant size awarded is between \$2,000 and \$10,000. A 1:1 match is required on grants from in-kind and/or cash.

<p>Community Engagement</p> <p>(20%)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Does the project engage historically underrepresented and/or vulnerable populations?• How much of the community will be engaged with the project?• Does the project engage Central Eastside businesses?
