



Monthly Report November 2022

Highlights from November 2022:

- The Safety for All team responded to 161 dispatches from 74 unique businesses, maintaining an average response time of within 8 minutes.
- The Care team supported 2 people applying to permanent housing. The team spent 26 hours working on case management involving housing & shelter support this month.
- The cleaning team removed 104,130 pounds of trash & 1,499 needles.
- The Safety For All team held their yearly Trauma Informed Care training. Additional training included emotional first aid with a focus on self care. In November, the Lead Safety Ambassador pursued CPR Instructor Certification, and the Lead Care Coordinator finished certification as a Mental Health First Aid trainer.

In November Central Eastside Together Staff:

- Hosted a Safety Hub meeting for businesses around the St. Francis area to coordinate CET Team response, connect neighbors, and facilitate problem solving between businesses and public services.
- Met with stakeholders to advance the goals of the Bioswale program and plan environmental, placemaking, and maintenance work for the winter.
- Sat on the panel for Prosper Portland's Inclusive Economic Development Strategy Leadership Roundtable discussion, elevating the needs and sharing experiences from the Central Eastside.
- Hosted a Business Forum event for District Businesses to speak directly to City Leadership and share experiences and concerns regarding safety, unsanctioned camping, and cleanliness in the District. This event brought CEID businesses in front of Mayor Ted Wheeler, Representative Rob Nosse, Police Chief Chuck Lovell, and was attended by staff from Senator Ron Wyden.

- Dispatches
 - 161 unique dispatch calls.
 - 49 of those dispatches were wellness checks and 18 were mental health-related.
 - 49 were presence patrols.*
 - There were 27 dispatches that resulted in the team asking someone to leave private property.**
 - 2 calls resulted in chaperone service requests.

- Hot Spots:
 - (Zone 2) SE Water & Stark; Large camp blocking pedestrian and bicycle right-of-way's with heavy foot-traffic
 - (Zone 7) SE 6th & Lincoln; Large vehicle and manmade camps with heavy foot traffic, reports of theft from businesses, and vandalism to property.
 - (Zone 5) SE 9th & Yamhill; Continued reoccurring camp presence with heavy-foot traffic and a large amount of bicycle/vehicle parts
 - (Zone 4) SE Water & Salmon (ODOT Blocks); several vehicle camps with reports of theft, heavy foot-traffic and trespassing on property.
 - (Zone 1) SE 9th & Flanders; Large vehicle and manmade camps blocking ADA accessibility, and heavy foot-traffic.

**Presence patrols are when the Safety Team is requested to patrol around a designated area or business to be a presence to help deter unwanted activity.*

***The team does not physically move anyone.*
