Commuter Pass / Transportation Wallet:

KMerrill provides an update on the commuter pass program and the transportation wallet. Both programs have had a decline in participants during COVID-19.

Parking Master Plan

AChail  introduces Rick Williams. RWilliams provides a presentation to the group going over the Central Eastside Parking Masterplan. BikeTown E-Bike Expansion

Adrienne introduces Steve Hoyt-McBeth. SHoyt-McBeth is the program manager for BikeTown. Earlier this month a new version of Biketown was introduced.

Updates include the following:

- Major expansion into East Portland and North Portland
- Increased bikes from 1,000 - 1,500
- Replaced the entire fleet to E-Bike
- Minimum age moved from 18 to 16 allowing for a safe routes to school partnership
- Price has increased to \$99 annually + 20 cents a minute
- Central Eastside Super Hub Zones have been removed

Additionally SHoyt-McBeth explains that all Transportation Wallet holders from September 2019 to present received \$99 in Biketown credits. All card holders will be notified.

AZucker asks what is happening to the old fleet.

SHoyt-McBeth explains that they are working to donate the bikes to a different city who is looking to start a program.
